Zadanie 3.

A: And now dear listeners Mary Smith will present her recipe.

B: Delicious, golden peanut butter muffins aren't too sweet and have a good nutty flavour. You could serve them with a curry or chicken dinner or with roast pork. For breakfast, pass them with butter and honey.

Preheat an oven to 200°C. In a large bowl stir and toss together the flour, brown sugar, baking powder and salt. In a medium bowl beat peanut butter until smooth, then beat in a few spoonfuls of the milk, melted butter and eggs. Stir in the peanuts. Add to the dry ingredients and stir until blended. Spoon into the muffin tins, filling each cup about three-quarters full. Bake until toothpick inserted in the center of a muffin comes out clean, about 15 minutes. Cool in the tins for 5 minutes, then remove. This amount of dough makes about 16 standard muffins.
